Special Election to authorize the continuation of additional levies for the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2025, July 1, 2026, July 1, 2027, July 1, 2028, July 1, 2029, and July 1, 2030; the purposes for which additional funds are needed and the approximate annual amounts for each purpose are as follows:

- 1. To provide funds to the Taylor County Schools Child Nutrition Program for free meals to all Taylor County school students through the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Program. \$100,000.00
2. To provide free admission to all Taylor County sporting events and choral and band concerts for all Taylor County students in Elementary, Middle, and High School. Also to provide free admission to all Taylor County residents 60 years and older with a school-issued pass to all Taylor County sporting events and choral and band concerts. \$55,000.00
3. To provide funds for the purchase of technology equipment, computers, materials, and technology staff. \$597,194.00

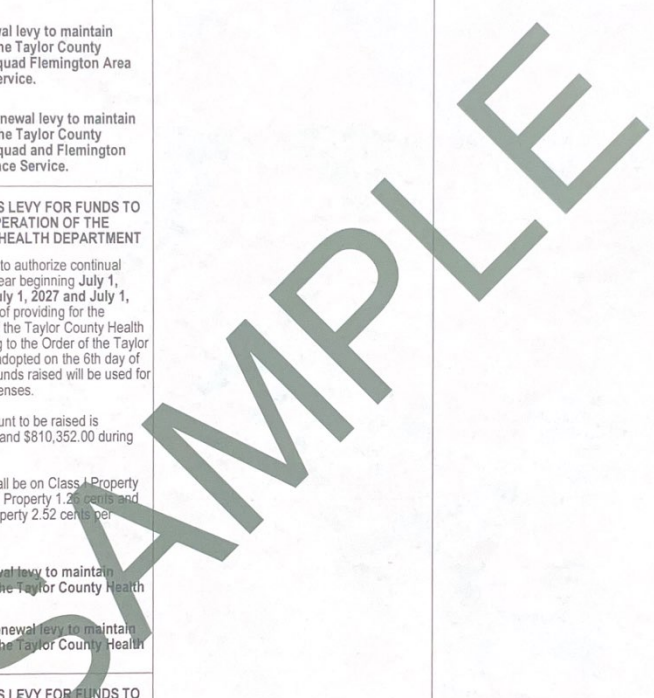
